

## Relationships

A marriage of convenience – брак по расчету  
Unequal match, unequal marriage – неравный брак  
A blind date - a date where the two people have never met before

To break up/to split up - end a relationship  
dump someone/walk out on someone - end a relationship by telling someone that you don't want to see him or her

To date someone - go on or have a date with someone  
To go out with someone - go on a date or be dating someone  
To be seeing each other - be dating someone  
To get engaged/hitched (married)  
pop the question- ask someone to marry you  
To get serious - a relationship becomes serious and long-term  
settle down- establish a regular routine after getting married

To be inconsistent with – идти вразрез с  
Not to make any difference to someone  
Prejudice against – предрассудки о чем-либо  
To cause misunderstanding вызывать недопонимание  
Bias against – предвзятое мнение о чем-либо

### Falling in love with someone

Love at first sight  
To fall for someone - fall in love with someone  
To be attracted to someone - feel a physical or emotional attraction to someone  
To be head over ears/heels in love with someone  
To be crazy about someone - think that another person is wonderful  
have a crush (on someone) - have strong feelings of love for someone (often for a short time and with no results)  
have a thing for (someone) - be attracted and care a lot about someone  
find Mr. Right - find the right or perfect person  
meet/find the right girl/guy- find the right partner, the one to marry  
the one (for someone) - the right partner, the one to marry  
to be someone's number one - the right partner, the one to marry  
To go hand in hand with someone – идти рука об руку с кем-то

### Positive relationship

get on like a house on fire = to get on really well with someone: "They get on like a house on fire."  
To be like two volumes of one book  
To be good together - two people who get along well with each other  
get along with someone- have a good friendly relationship with someone  
hit it off (with someone) - get along well with someone (usually from the beginning)  
made for each other - two people who get along extremely well  
a match made in heaven - a couple who get along perfectly

### Negative

get off on the wrong foot with someone = to start off badly with someone  
keep someone at arm's length = to keep someone at a distance  
they're like cat and dog = to often argue with someone  
rub someone up the wrong way = to irritate someone

### **inequality**

wear the trousers = to be in control: "She wears the trousers in their relationship."

be under the thumb = to be controlled by someone else: "He really keeps her under the thumb."
